

**\*\*Attention to those prospective buyers looking at either mustangs\*\***

***Pre-adoption approval is required to bid on either mustang!***

These mustangs are part of the Mustang Heritage Foundation & Bureau of Land Management and holds the current title. Because they have not been out of holding for more than a year and to ensure proper placement, the MHF/BLM keeps track of these mustangs for up to one year after rehoming. After the one year adoption date, the BLM will grant the title directly to the owner/adopter.

1. Select *adopting* at the start of the application
2. Anywhere at the top of the application, add *UWRF Colts In Training*
3. Fill out accordingly
  - \*Must include the freezebrand(s) you are requesting to adopt.

2018 Antelope Valley NV black mare has freezebrand **18638312**
  - \*While these mustangs are trained, they have not been exposed to an electric fence. Due to this, the BLM (Bureau of Land Management) requirements do include a 5'H minimum fencing and a paneled roundpen/small paddock while getting acclimated to an electric fence. Please include this description on your application
4. Application deadline is: **4/23/21. If you do not complete this application by the deadline, there will be a delay in pickup and there is a chance you may not be approved via the BLM for adoption**
5. The Wisconsin BLM office will be in contact with you after your submission to complete the process
